Class Schedule for Winter Quarter 2021

Master of Divinity and Master of Arts

First Year

BG102 Greek II4 units HintzoglouT/Th10:00-11:40A continuation of BG 101. This course completes the second part of the textbook.Prerequisite: BG 101 or approval of the instructor.

ST102 Doctrine of God and Man+ 4 units Loucks T/Th 8:00 - 9:40 A study covering two parts: God and Man. The first part deals with the essential nature, names and attributes of God, the Trinity, the divine decrees, creation and providence. The second part covers the doctrine of man, including the origin, nature and original state of man, man's fall, the doctrine of sin, and the covenant of grace.

NT102 NT II Acts and Pauline Epistles+ 4 units Wyatt F 8:00-11:40 This course contains an introductory survey of the Book of Acts and the Pauline Epistles. Issues relating to the date, authorship, historical setting, and theological emphases of each document will be discussed as well as the cultural and historical context of the world of Luke, Paul and their coworkers in the Gentile mission.

PM102 Pastoral Care & Counseling 4 units Purdy M 9:00-12:30 This course surveys the biblical theology of the church and her ordained pastoral teaching ministry, from masterworks in the Reformed tradition; the biblical foundation for a personal call to the pastoral-teaching ministry; the biblical theology of church government, from the Reformed and Presbyterian tradition; and principles for doing pastoral-teaching ministry or ministry in the local church setting for the purpose of church growth and/or revitalization.

EM102 Lifespan Devp. & Learning+4 unitsBonatW9.00-12:30This course provides us with a fundamental map in growing toward maturity, commitment, and
citizenship in the Kingdom of God brought by Jesus Christ.OutputOutput

Second Year

BH102 Hebrew II4 unitsWoodcockM/W10:00 – 11:40This is a continuation of BH 101. The course completes the study of basic elementsof Hebrew grammar. Prerequisite: BH 101 or approval of the instructor.

OT102 Prophets I or Prophets II+ 4 units Woodcock F 9:00 - 12:30 A study of the three eighth century Prophets of Israel (Amos, Hosea, and Micah). An emphasis will be on the message of the prophets and the descriptions of the religious and political situations in the Northern and Southern Kingdoms. Literary form and Structure of each book will also receive due attention. OT 102B Prophets II can replace this course.

ME102 Biblical Theology of Missions+ 4 units Dharmaraj T 8:00 - 11:40 An introduction to mission emphasizing the biblical basis for mission. OT and NT data will be used to evaluate both the motives and methods of missions and an evaluation of past and present mission strategies and techniques.

ME105 Cross Cultural Ministry*** 4 units Dharmaraj Th 8:00-11:40 This course is to help students understand the cross-cultural nature of the modern urban world and ministry in a cross-cultural setting. Special attention is given to effective ministry and continued growth in the Christian life. (Required for MA Missions)

PR 102 Expository Preaching3 unitsHintzoglouTh1:30 – 4:10Students are to compose and deliver sermons with special attention to a contemporary audience.Emphasis will be on audience analysis and sociological awareness to be reflected in sermons.

CH102 Church History II Reformation & Awakening+ 4 units Purdy W 9:00 12:30 This course is the study of the historical development of Christian movement from the 15th century to the end of the 18th century- the Great Awakening. The course seeks to provide theological foundations in understanding history in the perspective of "God's fullness of time" for events and significant reformers that impacted the churches then and to assist students in understanding and evaluating historical events and individuals that influenced or challenged the norm of the time. Prerequisite: CH IO1

PT102 Apologetics+3 unitsPremkumarW1:30 -4:10Analysis and application of the classical and contemporary systems which attempt aphilosophical defense of the Christian faith against the traditional and contemporary attacksarising within and without the Christian Church. PT 101 and PT 102 are interchangeable.

NT506 Introduction to NT Christology+3/5Wyatt Th1:30-4:10This is a comprehensive course to examine distinctive themes of various New Testament authors.Special attention is given to a variety of approaches to New Testament Theology and the use of the OldTestament as translation for NT Christology and Eschatology.
